

UPDATING LARGE AMOUNTS OF DATA

Global updates

There are times when you need to make the same change on a large group of data. For example, a salesman leaves and you want to assign all his customers to a new salesman number. It is very time consuming (not to mention boring!) to call up each customer and make the same change. Now, in Version 12, there are some new functions that will let you do all the changes at once. We call these "Global" updates.

We will use the salesman change as our example because it is a very common problem.

Here are the steps you would need to take:

1. **Go to Create-A-Report, Extract/Sort report data. Generate an extract file containing all the customers whose salesman number you wish to change.**

In the example above, this would be all customers having the old salesman number.

If you are not familiar with the Create-A-Report extract function, check out the Online Manual under the Help heading at the bottom right side of the menu.

2. **Go to Create-A-Report, Global updates, Global updates of data on customer file from CAR list.**

You will see a screen something like this:

Check the box of all the data you want to change, then enter the new code.

You can change more than one code at a time. For example, you could set both the primary and the secondary salesman numbers.

Just leave the check boxes for the other types of data unchecked. They will be not be affected by the change.

That's all there is to it!

The types of data listed are the ones we've been asked to do these types of changes on in the past. Additional fields may be added in the future.

There are similar screens for vendors, items, and orders.

Updating data from a File

Sometimes the data is a little more complicated than the scenario described above. For example, you may be reassigning customer numbers based on region. Or you want to update a new price list for your items. For these types of situations, we have set up a new function to let you update the data from a tab-delimited or an Excel file.

You can create the file in any way you wish. For example, you may extract the data you want to change and export it to Excel. Then, make the adjustments you want to make and update the Lakeshore file with those changes.

Suppose you have this file.

Go to **Reference Information, Customer, Update customer from file** and fill out the screen as follows:

Click on the Browse button and you will see your regular “My Computer” dialog where you can look up the file you want to upload.

Once you select it, the name will be copied to the new file name. If your original file name has embedded spaces or certain characters that Linux doesn’t allow in file names, these will be replaced with underscore characters. You may change the new file name if you wish.

File name should not contain embedded spaces or the characters "#", "&", "+" or "\$" or apostrophe (') or quotes (")

Once you click the “Upload” button, the file will be uploaded to the “windows_area” directory on the Linux server. You will be returned to the original update screen and the file name will be filled in with the file you uploaded.

This upload works for the customer and item updates as well as for update script used to generate orders from a file.
